



#### INTERVIEW WITH A MEMBER OF STAFF

Ask your manager or supervisor if they can spare you 20-30 minutes for **you to interview them**. If not, choose anybody else who can tell you what you need to know. Don't forget to thank them afterwards!

#### 1. Skills and Qualities

Work experience is an excellent way for you to develop your understanding of the skills and qualities you will need to get the sort of job you want and to do it well. If you know what employers really value in their staff you can start to equip yourself for the future. See if the people you work with during the week say the same sort of things as your teachers and parents/carers.





## The Buddy Programme.



- To introduce our year 6 to the academy and their tutor groups
- To provide support for Year 7 students joining the school by ensuring that each new student has the support of an older student who is prepared to be a friendly face and an informal source of information for them.
- To provide opportunities for the senior students to undertake a position of responsibility.
- To enhance the personal development of Year 11 students; increasing their self-confidence and giving them the satisfaction of being able to help others.

# Roles and responsibilities of a Buddy



- Each Buddy will be linked to a Year 7 student.
- The Buddy should be a positive role model and try to help their Year 7 student to feel confident about school.
- They should be a friendly face and help their Year 7 student to settle in by showing them around the school at the start of the school year and throughout Term 1.
- The Buddy should make sure that they check with their Year 7 student each day for the first month and then regularly after that, to help them settle into Churchill.
- The Buddy should provide information and informal support.

## Selection and Involvement



- Students in year 10 will be selected as Buddies by their Tutors and HoH, in term 6
- The expectation will be that most of Year 10 become a Buddy unless:
  - They specifically do not wish to take on the role.
  - They are considered by their Tutor/HoH not to be an appropriate role model.

## Support for each Buddy



- •Their Tutor is the first point of contact for each Buddy should they have a concern about the student that they are supporting.
- Buddies should immediately seek the advice of their tutor if they have any worries or concerns about their Year 7 student.
- Buddies should not have contact with their Year 7 student's parents/carers.
