Not Going to Uni?

If you have been offered/accepted an **apprenticeship**, contact the employer or training provider to confirm your results and ask them to confirm the start date, as due to Coronavirus, some are delaying it. If you haven't met the apprenticeship grade requirements, still contact the employer with your grades as there may be some leeway.

If you are looking for a vacancy, keep looking, but it's important to have a back-up plan because there are fewer than expected vacancies and competition is high. Search for apprenticeship vacancies at <u>https://www.gov.uk/apply-apprenticeship</u> and set up an alert to be notified about relevant vacancies as they come up. You should be as proactive as possible in searching for a vacancy and also contact employers that interest you directly. Follow this link for application and interview tips.
