If you are aiming to get an apprenticeship, remember that there is no guarantee you will get one by September, and so it is important to have a back-up plan. If you're in year 11, this could be applying to Sixth Form or to a college for a full-time course. You can still keep looking and applying for apprenticeship vacancies and if you get one, you can then decline the back-up plan offer. If you're in Sixth Form, apprenticeship vacancies are advertised year round as they are not only for school/college leavers, so keep applying and consider gaining relevant work experience whilst you continue to job hunt.


