


# Careers Newsletter

## Virtual Work Experience and Employer Insight Activities

UK University & Apprenticeship Search Fair - Weds 17th March 12pm-6pm

The UK University & Apprenticeship Search Virtual Fair will be returning on March 17th to help students from Years 11, 12 and 13 explore their post 18 options, with over 100 universities, colleges and apprenticeship providers from across the UK attending. Students will be able to speak directly with admissions teams and recruitment officers from Russell Group, Red Brick, Modern & Specialist universities, along with higher & degree apprenticeship providers. - **Cardiff University** are running a series of higher education webinars to provide advice and guidance on a range of topics to those interested in going to university.
