Year 11s - Post-16 Planning

All 16 year olds in England have to stay in education or training until they are 18 and so year 11s need to start considering their post-16 plans soon. Attending open days/events is one of the best ways to gain inspiration, consider what courses will suit them and to get a feel for the different environments that sixth form, colleges, training providers and apprenticeships have to offer. 

Unifrog

Unifrog partner with schools to support students to progress into the best opportunity for them. They do this by providing a one-stop-shop where students can explore their interests, then find and successfully apply for their best next-step after school. The below gives a snapshot of the different areas covered.



All students will have a Unifrog account and the programme can be used outside of school as well as in lessons where it is particularly used for exploring pathways and careers, recording competencies and activities, and for CV writing.

Parents can also access Unifrog as if they are a student. Follow this link <u>Unifrog Sign-In</u>, click on 'Been given a Sign up Code?', enter the code **CASFParents** plus some further required details to create your own 'student' account.



Post-14 Technical Education
