
Exploring Careers

SACU Spartan Quiz

The SACU quiz takes just five minutes and uses images to allow students to identify what best represents them. From this information an interactive 'career cloud' is produced where students can simply select any of the roles listed go to a job profile for further exploration. This careers quiz provides inspiration in a unique and visual way <u>SACU Spartan Quiz</u>



For older year groups, not only is a career cloud produced, but also a 'degree cloud' and an 'apprenticeship cloud', helping students to consider what might suit them for post 16 and post 18 planning.



Work Experience Year 10s

Any students that haven't yet found a work placement for 3-7 July need to start looking earnestly now, as all students need to find an in-person placement for that week unless they are away on a school trip (in which case they need to find a placement for another week, ideally during non-term time).
