


Short talks during the evening include the topics 'going to University', student finance, apprenticeships and specifically on careers in law, architecture, aviation and sports & fitness.

## Year 10 Work Experience


All students go on a block work experience placement during year 10 and, unless on a school trip, it will be during the week of 8-12 July this year. Students with parental/carer support need to find a placement and once the consent form is returned to the school reception with the details, we instigate a Health & Safety check and confirm with the employer. We have provided all students with access to a database of employers who have offered placements in the last few years as a good starting point for who to contact.
