Transition





The Academy's learning is organised into four stages:

► Transition: Year 6 into Year 7

From the moment students are offered a place at Churchill, they are part of our Academy. Every student is visited in their primary school before they join us for our Transition Day and Drama day in July. Students with additional needs have a bespoke transition programme to ensure they make the best start to secondary school.

▶ **Secondary Foundation:** Year 7, 8 and 9

The secondary foundation stage gives our students a wide experience to build on core learning from primary school, and bring to life the inspiration and wonder of enquiry, creative and independent learning skills.

In the Sixth Form, our advanced stage curriculum is broad and engaging, with enrichment and personal development built in. Alongside exceptional teaching across a wide range of courses, the Sixth Form prepare our students for life beyond school.
